

Business Manager's Report

We are halfway through the year. It seems 2022 just got started and now it is July already. I have said, we have said, the last couple of years how good the workload is and is going to be and it has been busy. I believe we have seen some areas have a slow start to our work season this year, due to weather in some cases, material shortages or just a slow start. As always, it is the worker that it affects first, "stay home, no work today". Most everybody outside of our industry think we make big wages, but don't know of all the days we don't have a chance to work, and no work, means no pay. They get their pay based on 2,080 hours, and as good as work has been, our average has been 1,750 to 1,800 hours a year, which is a good number for Operators. You make me proud to work for such hardworking people, to endure the tough conditions that we have to make a living. That being said, we can't let our guard down. Contractors prey on

good times as well as bad times. Local 103 Operators show up to do the job, and expect to be paid what we have coming to us. We are fortunate to have the work and the man hours we have right now, and I believe more is still to come, but as many new apprentices and journeyman alike, we have to continue to work hard to keep what we have, and be prepared as possible for tomorrow. Look out for each other, but if you see someone you don't know, ask them for their card. If they don't have a card, call the hall and report it to an agent so we can protect our Union, we can never let up. Contractors that want to play games with Operators do so at their own risk, because in most cases, you can come to the hall and be back out to work the next day.

Congress passed the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act, a once in a generation investment in our nation's infrastructure and competitiveness. For too long, Washington policy makers have celebrated "infrastructure week" to grab headlines, without ever agreeing to build infrastructure. The President promised to work across the aisle to deliver results and rebuild our crumbling infrastructure. After the President put forth a plan to do exactly that and then negotiated a deal with members of Congress from both parties, this historic legislation was signed into law on November 15, 2021.

This Bipartisan Infrastructure Law will rebuild America's roads, bridges and rails, expand access to clean

drinking water, ensure every American has access to high-speed internet, tackle the climate crisis, advance environmental justice and invest in communities that have too often been left behind. The legislation eases inflationary pressures and strengthens supply chains by making long overdue improvements to our ports, airports, rail and roads. It drives the creation of good paying union jobs and grows the economy sustainably so that everyone gets ahead for years to come. Combined with the President's Build Back Better framework, it will add 1.5 million jobs per year, for the next ten years.

In the United States, 1 in 5 miles of highways and major roads, and 45,000 bridges, are in poor condition. The legislation will reauthorize surface transportation programs for five years and invest \$110 billion in additional funding to repair our roads and bridges

Apprenticeship & Training Report

We have been very busy at the Training Site since the beginning of class season at the end of November. Many of our classes were full to capacity with a waiting list. If you are scheduled to be in a class and can't attend, please call us and let us know. We will then fill the open spot in that class with the first person off the waiting list. If we get enough people on the waiting list we will try to schedule an additional class. The 2022/2023 class schedules will be mailed out to all the members in early October 2022. If you do not receive the schedule, please contact the Apprenticeship Office at 765-378-0013 or go to our website at www.iuoe103training.org to get signed up for any classes you may need. We are continuing satellite classes at each district office again this year. You will be able to take OSHA 10, Hazmat Refresher, MSHA Refresher and Orientation Classes. Please check all of your certifications and get signed up for your yearly updates as classes fill up very quickly.

We are anticipating a huge work load this season. We have already done two new Apprentice classes, totaling 54 new apprentices. We have another new class scheduled to start on Monday June 6th. The wet weather slowed our dispatch rate for apprentices in Ft Wayne and Kokomo, but here in the last week, they have also been dispatching all their apprentices. Indianapolis is dispatching as fast as we can get them through their 2 weeks of initial training. We currently (June 3rd) have no apprentices on the out of work list in District 1. District 2 also now has 0 apprentices and District 3 has 1. Our number of apprentices has now climbed to a new high of 231. Once again, I would like to ask our seasoned journeymen and women to please try to help any apprentice needing some direction or a pointer that might help him/her to complete the task at hand.

We are still receiving a lot of calls regarding registration for written exams. NCCCO has changed the

written exam registration to an online only process. Going forward, to sign up for a written exam you will need to go to www.ncco.org. You will need a few pieces of information from the training program before you can register for the exam. Member will need test site coordinators name: James R. Ratican, our address: 4277 E CR 67, Anderson.

IN 46017 and the test site number for that particular exam date. Our next 2 written exam dates will be Sunday July 17th (Test site #IN60789) and October 16th 2022 (Test site #IN60786). Your payment for exams you are applying for will be required at the time of the registration. The program will reimburse eligible members for exams passed once we have received the detailed score report from NCCCO. Practical exam registration has also gone to online registration only. Members will need to go to www.nccco.org to get registered and pay for their exam. You will then receive an authorization code for each crane that we need for your score sheets when you take the test. The authorization code is good for good for 6 months. If you have any further questions, please give us a call at 765-378-0013.

I hope everyone is having a great 2022 so far. I know you aren't looking for a weather report, but unfortunately, it's been an undeniably wet start to the season. Fortunately, the workload is there when the weather breaks.

East Marion County is booming with road work. Superior is full bore on the downtown split. Gradex, Rieth-Riley, and Beaty are working on the Clear Path Project. Milestone is doing the Emerson bridge over 65 south. Crider, Wilhelm, and Calumet are joint venture on the Purple Line on 38th St for the next couple years. Plus, there is plenty of other work, with Gainbridge Fieldhouse, State Fair Grounds, and Bottle Works.

Hancock County seems to be the next Plainfield and Whitestown. Poindexter and Gradex are doing a box building on every corner. IES, Ryan Inc, and Midwest Paving are doing numerous housing additions. Milestone has started a two-year project on I-70, adding a lane each direction from Mt. Comfort past S.R. 9. Shelby County is starting to see its fair share of box buildings as well. With that comes the infrastructure work to accommodate.

DISTRICT No. 1 By WADE SPARKS Financial Secretary/Business Representative

Work this year is phenomenal. Superior will be staring on the northwest side on 465 bridges over 96th St. ICC Group just started on 30th St. bridge over White River, which is a two-year job, and they're still on the Kessler Blvd. bridge over White River. F.A. Wilhelm has a handful of small jobs in Marion County. IU Health is one of their big ones. It's looking like a 6-to-7-year job. You must have 10 Hour OSHA to work there. Renascent Inc. is at IU Health digging the basement. Beaty Construction is working on the lagging and tire backs. They still have a way to go before footers come in to play. White is working on a walk path along Fall

Creek and 16th St. Kokosing Industrial will soon be starting on the Indiana Ave. bridge over Fall Creek. This will be a two-year job.

Rieth-Riley and E & B Paving are paving all across Marion and Johnson counties. White Construction is working on State Road 36 & 465, adding turn lanes on 36. There's a lot of work at the Indianapolis International Airport. FedEx is expanding a new runway, phase 1, with Walsh Construction removing the runway. Other contractors working on this job include Rieth-Riley, Bansal Construction, Spartan Construction, and Javelina Construction. Northern Materials is making the concrete for the runway, consisting of very long shifts. Alberici Constructors is working on a new FedEx building. Working alongside Alberici on this project is Fox Contractors, Overhead Conveyor Co. and Edco-Evans Development Co. Walsh is working on the I-69 project, this is a big job. It's expected to last about 2 ½ more years with long hours included. Milestone Contractors, Crider & Crider, Mt. Carmel Stabilization Group and Rieth-Riley all have a piece of the pie.

As for Gradex, there are multiple boxes being built in Johnson County. One off of Allen Rd. & Collins Rd. and 3 boxes on Graham Rd. & County Rd. 600 N, just off of I-65. As of now they are coming to completion on a box on Bob Glidden Blvd. & I-65. Poindexter Excavating is working on a large box right off of Bob Glidden Blvd. & Paul Hand Blvd. They will soon start another project on Whiteland Rd. & Graham Rd. Milestone has two jobs off of State Road 144 & I-65. Crider & Crider also has a box off of State Road 144 & Jim Black Rd. Atlas Excavating is working on 2 jobs in Franklin. SK-JV is still working 3 shifts for the tunnel project. Crane Barns are all staying busy, often looking for Oiler's with their Class A CDL's. Asphalt plants are running around the clock. There are 2 big projects fixing to start in the near future; Elanco at the old GM plant and a Motel and Ball Room at Pan Am Plaza next to the convention center. This will be a 3-to-5-year project. If

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you have time this winter you should get your 10 Hour OSHA and MSHA. They're needed on multiple jobs. Have a safe and prosperous year.

Just like last year, this summer's work load has not disappointed. There is a lot of work in District 1 and we're just getting started with no signs of letting up. Rieth-Riley is finishing up on 146th Street and 37 getting ready to start a bridge and round-a-bout on US 31 at 276th Street outside of Atlanta. They're working at Smokey Row Road and the Monon Trail in Carmel and 3rd Avenue and Autumn Drive to 2nd Street.

Fox and Beaty are up at 131st Street and 37. Fox is doing a housing addition in Lapel. 3-D Company has a round-about and pipe job at 156th and Boden Road and a road project at 191st, west of



Calumet is at 116th and Rangeline Road putting

in a round-a-bout and also working at 32 and River Road. E & B Paving has resurfacing projects in both Madison and Hamilton Counties. Thanks to everyone for covering our work. Have a safe and prosperous year.

Work in the southern counties of District Two is in full swing. Fleming has started the sanitary sewer extension contract in Decatur and should take at least until December to complete. United Pipe was awarded 28 anomaly digs in Adams and Huntington County. Work on the digs began in late June and should be completed by mid-August. Milestone should be starting the bridge replacement on US 224, just west of Decatur in mid-July; Fleming did the clearing for the project.

E&B is working on box culvert projects on US 124 on both the east and west side of Bluffton. Brooks and E&B are hard at it in the southern counties of District Two with private and state

work throughout the counties. Indiana Earthworks has started the Losantville sewer project and should be there until late August or mid-September. They also picked up the Fountain City utility project, the start date has yet to be determined.

In Muncie, 3D is working on the Nebo Rd. project and at the new Brown Amphitheatre at Ball State. Bowen is still working on the Muncie utility project with more added each year. Bunn is working on the demo of the old science building at Ball State. Crider & Crider is still at the Can Pack project on the south side of Muncie with site and utility work to finish up.

The demo work of the old paint shop at General Motors is underway. Adamo Demolition is doing the work with International Industrial Contracting as the prime. Crane work in the southern counties has been slow. Thank you all. Continue to look for one another and have a safe season!

Hello Brothers & Sisters, hope all is well. Another busy season in District 3. Several roads across the western counties are closed due to total reconstructs. Which include St Rd 28 in Frankfort, St Rd 28 west of 52, St Rd 26 from St 29 to St Rd 75, St Rd 38 from Mulberry West to Dayton, and Haggerty Lane in Lafayette. All are east/west Roads. St Rd 75 will be closed due to box culvert replacement. 421 from Delphi to Rossville will be closed for our 2nd CCPR project. I 65 is going under the knife with 9 total miles, which include bridge(s), drainage, added lanes, along with the ramp replacement at St Rd 43. The end result will be 3 travel lanes extending past the St Rd 43 exit.

Yeager Rd and Teel Rd are both getting the works this year as well. The Frankfort Waste Water Treatment plant project is all but wrapped up. There is another phase at the Walnut Creek Landfill, a 1700-acre solar farm, Frankfort School Corp. project(s) that include; sidewalks, curbs, ADA ramps, and mill and fills on the parking lots. Several bridges and box culvert projects, include Haggerty Lane, I 65, St 52, St Rd 75, and St Rd 43. Several mill and fill jobs across the western district. St Rd 52, St Rd 24, St Rd 38, St Rd 421, 9th Street in Lafayette. Four housing additions, another CSO tank project in Lafayette. Building projects include: 1 box building, parking garage, and a hyper-sonic lab building and there are 2 dam maintenance projects.

As far as wind work, we have done several repairs, such as gear box and bearing replacements. The Vestas Blade Replacement project is wrapped up. Currently we are just loading out the last few blades. There are approximately 16,000 Apprentice hours and 25,600 Journeyman hours to date. Per Vestas, there are no currently recordables or significant near misses! Local 103 has received recognition from Vestas for this accomplishment. A lot of future work yet to let this year. I want to wish everyone a safe and prosperous season.
